- 2) A farmer has enough fodder to feed his twenty cows for sixty days.
- If he buys ten more cows, how long will the food last?
  - If he wants to have food for seventy-five days, what does he have to do?
- 3) Fill in the gaps knowing that the following amounts are directly proportional:

  - The number of people inside a car and the number of kilometers it can travel
- 6) A van traveling at a speed of 60km/h needs 15 minutes to cover a distance. How much time would it need if the speed was 75km/h?
- 7) In a map 2 cm = 3 km. What's the real distance between two cities that are 8 cm apart on the map?
- 8) The price of a shirt was €25, but I got a discount of 20%. How much did I pay for the shirt?
